1. Electricidade de Moçambique E.P. ("EdM"), in partnership with Globeleq Africa Limited / EleQtra ("Globeleq/EleQtra") and Sasol New Energy Holdings Ltd ("Sasol"), is developing a 400-MW Independent Power Producer ("IPP") project at Temane in the Inhambane Province of Mozambique. The plant will use natural gas from the nearby PSA gas fields, to be developed and operated by Sasol Petroleum Mozambique Lda.
2. The Temane IPP will be connected to the electricity grid in the Maputo area in southern Mozambique through a 560-km, 400-kV line, also including three new substations at Vilankulos, Chibuto and Matalane, known as the Temane Transmission Project ("TTP"). The TTP is considered Phase 1 of the larger interconnection between Maputo and Tete regions, known as Sociedade Nacional de Transporte de Energia ("STE"). The TTP will be implemented as a publicly financed project, which will connect the Temane IPP plant and any other future plant along the TTP corridor to the transmission network. The TTP will be structured as a wholly owned EDM subsidiary company.
3. The World Bank Group (WB) is considering financial support to EdM for the TTP project. The WBG maintains high Environmental and Social (E&S) standards on all activities it contributes to fund, and expects EdM to also apply the same international standards on the TTP project (and on the CTT project as associated facility, by EDM engaging with its CTT partners). Consultants are already in the process of preparing WBG standards based ESIA's and RAPs for both the TTP and Temane IPP projects.
4. A review of the Temane Regional Electricity Project identified the need to strengthen the internal E&S capability and capacity within EdM to manage the TTP project and oversee the E&S aspects of the CTT project (and eventually other EDM owned/managed projects and its supply chain/partner projects) based on WBG standards and requirements and international good practice. The E&S review revealed the following key concerns:

- a. EDM's E&S unit does not have sufficient capacity, it is fragmented, and needs to be consolidated and strengthened;
 - b. EDM's Health and Safety (H&S) Specialists are housed in different units, and capacity should be strengthened, and the H&S management be integrated into the ESMS.
 - c. EDM needs to develop an integrated Environmental and Social Management System (ESMS) as a reliable and systematic approach to manage, oversee, and report on E&S performance of a growing number of projects.
5. EdM now invites eligible consulting firms ("Consultants") to indicate their interest in providing certain consulting services related to an ESMS gap analysis, system design (including manual) and roadmap development for EDM (Task 1); analysis, design of ESMS and roadmap implementation (Task 2); and monitoring of ESMS performance and ad-hoc support (Task 3). The envisaged duration of the consultancy assignment is one (1) year. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The shortlisting criteria for which the Consultant should provide specific information are as follows:
- a. Relevant contracts completed by the Consultant's company within the last five (5) years where ESMS development / implementation management and support services have been provided. Information should include a summary of scope, country, duration and client contact information.
 - b. Experience information demonstrating in-depth understanding of the WBG Policies/IFC Performance standards, ISO standards and related ESMS requirements.
 - c. CVs of key personnel of the Consultant demonstrating solid knowledge and ESMS experience, including experience working in Africa and preferably in Mozambique.
6. Consultants will be selected in accordance with the procedures set out in the World Bank's Guidelines: "Selection and Employment of Consultants under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits and Grants by World Bank Borrowers (January 2011 and Revised July 2014)", using "Selection Based on the Consultants' Qualifications (CQS)".

7. Expression of Interest must be submitted in English in a sealed envelope and delivered by courier or electronically on or before 04 December 2018 at 15.30h local time, and be clearly marked **Expression of Interest for: Consultancy Services for Mozambique Temane Regional Electricity Project – ESMS Support.**
